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| *Share your reading book with an adult three times in a week. | Practise your weekly spellings for 5 minutes a day. | In preparation for your weekly maths test, practise your times tables (Year 2s) or addition and subtraction calculations (year 1s). Practise them three times in a week. Remember you only have 3 minutes to complete up to 30 questions. By completing all the questions in the allotted time, you can earn a certificate. If you are unsure which calculations your child is currently working on, please send a message via dojo. | Create a snap game to play with a partner by drawing 4 different sea creatures on pieces of card. Draw each creature 5 times. |
| Read a book and write a short review about it. Would you recommend it to your friends in Dragonfly class? | Can you write sentences containing each word from your weekly spellings? | | Find out about how holidays have changed over time. Ask your parents and grandparents about the holidays that they went on as children and write down what you find out. |
| Complete a reading comprehension activity from the class webpage. | Think about a holiday you have been on. | Read a book Can you spot any words linked with your spellings this week? Write the words down and then put them in a sentence. | Write and send a letter to an author or illustrator. Remember to tell them about you, what you enjoyed about the book and ask them questions. If you are lucky, you might receive a letter back from them. | Write as many facts as you can about the number 24. Play the addition and subtraction to 20 snakes and ladders game from the class webpage. Once you have played the game, create your own maths boardgame. | The Victorians used bathing machines when they went to the seaside. Draw a picture or create a model of your own bathing machine.  |
| Use the internet to find some pictures of some sea creatures. Can you research some facts about them? | Write a character description about a creature that you would find at the beach or in the ocean. | Create your own maths quiz with an answer sheet. Year 2 Roll a dice 4 times to create two 2digit numbers. Add the numbers together. What is your total? Subtract the smaller number from the greatest number. What is you answer? Repeat this until you have at least 10 different calculations. | Create your own seaside Create a quiz about beaches, oceans and underwater creatures. |
