




**Homework Activities for Otter Class**



Topic - Rainforests	Writing	Reading	SPAG	Maths
Sadly, many parts of the rainforest around the world are being destroyed. Research this and make a poster to encourage people to 'Save the rainforest.'	Research a rainforest animal and write a fact sheet about it.	Read to an adult at least 3 times per week and talk about what you have read. Ask your adult to make a comment in your reading log.	Practise your weekly spellings for 5 minutes a day - ask an adult to dictate a sentence for you to write using each word or write your own sentence that uses them.	Practising different times tables.  Choose 1 times table a week and ask an adult to ask you some 'quick-fire' questions!
Make a rainforest themed word search.  	Imagine that you are Podkin, Paz or Pook, from our class reading book 'The Legend of Podkin-One Ear.' Write a diary entry to describe one of the exciting / terrifying events that has happened so far.	Read a book by an author you've never read before and write a book review.  Briefly describe the plot, characters and setting. Would you recommend this book to a friend – why / why not?		Research what foods are found / grown in rainforests and either make your own recipe up or follow one which uses some of these as ingredients. Remember to measure the ingredients carefully!
Create your own rainforest! You could use any materials you wish from Lego to cardboard or wool.  	Imagine you are walking through a rainforest and use all your senses to create an atmospheric poem or descriptive paragraph.	Read about rainforests and record what you find out in an interesting way!
