



Introduction to our topic

During our topic, Going Global, children will discover that transport and communication can connect the world in more ways than ever before. What we buy and what we consume can have a profound impact on the lives and societies of people around the world. We will learn about other's cultures and needs, discover ways to support one another and work together locally, nationally and globally.

Our key learning this term

Personal and social development	<p>Togetherness Through the whole school value of togetherness, we will explore the characteristics of friendships, including mutual respect, truthfulness and trustworthiness.</p>
English	<p>Reading Our class guided reading book for this term is: Fantastic Mr Fox.</p> <p>Writing We will be focusing on writing an action story, a persuasive letter linked to fair trade and our own poetry based on the poem 'If I were in charge of the world'.</p> <p>Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar We will have regular SPaG meetings to revisit, develop and challenge prior knowledge such as: conjunctions, prepositions, commas in lists and plurals.</p>
Maths	<p>Place Value We will be reading and writing 3- or 4-digit numbers; identifying, representing, and estimating numbers; partitioning numbers; ordering and comparing numbers.</p> <p>Addition and Subtraction In the final few weeks of term, we will be adding and subtracting 3 or 4-digit numbers and beginning to solve addition and subtraction problems. We will have regular maths meetings to revisit, develop and challenge prior knowledge.</p>
Computing	<p>Online searchers and surfers In this unit, children will learn about what the Internet is, how the Internet works and the three different types of connections that can be used. They will then have the opportunity to explore web browsers and search engines, learning how to detect if a web page can be trusted whilst also ensuring that they know how to stay safe online. Finally, they will learn how to copy and paste images from the web and complete their own mini project.</p>
Science	<p>Animals including humans We will be looking at how animals, including humans, need specific types and amounts of nutrition to help us move and grow. Animals cannot make their own food; they get nutrition from what they eat. We will also be learning how humans and some other animals have skeletons and muscles for support, protection and movement.</p>

The Arts (Art & Design, Design and Technology, Music, Drama)	<p>Art - Printing This term, we will explore West African tie dye and batik prints linked to Fair Trade. The children will then make their own string printing block.</p> <p>D.T. - Food We will begin to learn where and how a variety of ingredients are grown, reared, caught and processed. Following our research, we will design a world foods buffet, incorporating food from each continent (except Antarctica!).</p> <p>Music – This little light of mine Our focus for this term will be on Gospel music. We will also learn what a pentatonic scale is, explore call and response in music and perform off-beat rhythms.</p>
Humanities (R.E., History, Geography)	<p>R.E. - What do Christian people believe about agape? Christians try to be like Jesus and obey his teachings in the things that they think and do. This unit explores the meaning behind different stories (parables) that Jesus told about agape.</p> <p>Geography This term we will locate countries using maps, atlases and globes to discover where our food, clothes and other products come from. We will also learn about the importing and exporting of goods and the importance of fair trade. We will also focus on tourism and eco-tourism, looking specifically at the impact it has on countries and cultures.</p> <p>History - Black History Month We will be learning about The Bristol Bus Boycott in 1936 and its lasting legacy.</p>
P.E.	<p>Multi-skills This term we will focus on the fundamentals of: movement, throwing, catching and aiming. We will progress to team invasion sport and a house competition.</p> <p>Archery Mr Meek will be teaching us this new sport. We will be learning a range of skills including: proper stance, putting the arrow in the bow, gripping the string, drawing the bow, aiming at the target, releasing the arrow.</p>
Modern Foreign Language - Spanish	<p>I'm learning Spanish By the end of term, we will be able to ask and answer some basic questions in Spanish such as: 'How are you?' and 'What is your name?' We will be able to count from one to ten in Spanish and know ten different colours.</p>
